## Autism Assembly

This year in school, we are completing work to achieve the Autism NI Impact Award which celebrates schools and workplaces which have “autism friendly environments”!

On Wednesday 23rd November, Miss Swanson and Mrs Witherow, who are the school’s Autism Champions, along with Mrs Garrett, presented the topic of autism in assembly for all pupils in Primary 1 to 7.

The assembly introduced pupils to the fact that differences are good and should be celebrated. It also taught children about ‘noticeable’ and ‘hidden’ differences. The pupils were encouraged to think about their sensory differences and were shown how simple everyday tasks can be more challenging for autistic pupils.

The pupils were also shown the range of strategies and resources we already have in school to support autistic learners, including our sensory den and trail, our cosy café and playground quiet zones as well as the many fidget toys and wobble chairs we must support those who need movement during the day.

Some more resources will be coming to school over the next few weeks and more strategies including a KSI quiet

playground zone and a KS2 lunchtime club will also be implemented in the upcoming weeks.

The final message which was made clear to all pupils is the fact that the strategies put in place in school will not only positively impact autistic pupils, but in fact, all learners will benefit.

## Community Choices

As part of the Community Choices project, P6 and P7 had a visit from the Mayor of Causeway Coast and Glens Borough Council on Thursday 24<sup>th</sup> November.

He listened to our ideas that we had discussed about helping our community and we had the chance to ask him some questions about his job (as well as his thoughts on a range of other topics), which turned out to be a lot of fun and an excellent eye opener into what life is like as a local councillor!

We even got to try on his mayoral chain, which is worth over £330, 000! Many thanks to Mayor Ivor Wallace for taking time to chat to our P6 and P7 classes.
