# Medical Information

As you are already aware there is now a requirement for schools to update their pupil's records with regards to 'medically prescribed needs'. This also means that the responsibility lies with you, the parents/guardians to ensure we as a school are informed **immediately** if your child requires 'special medication' such as an inhaler to treat asthma, an Epipen to treat severe allergies etc.

As a school we are now obliged to seek a letter from your GP to confirm any such conditions. If this is the case, please make contact with your GP and the school to confirm any such conditions. #### RADAR Visit

Thursday 19th September proved to be an exciting day for our Primary 6 and 7 class as they travelled (along with Mrs Sheridan and Miss Milliken) to the RADAR (Risk Avoidance Danger Awareness Resource) Centre in Belfast.

This is not the first time our school has visited the centre and once again the class represented our school well.

Opened in December 2015, RADAR is interactive, informative and fun and is Northern Ireland's first fully interactive, safety and life skills education centre. Throughout the visit pupils took part in a range of interactive workshops on Road Safety, Fire Safety, E-Safety, Personal Safety and Youth

Justice. The centre contained a full sized street scene with a house, bus, train, court room, prison cell, shop, police station and much more. As you can imagine a great day out was had by all and the evidence can be seen in just a few of the photographs below.



# Safety Reminder

Sadly, over the month of September I have noticed (and have been made aware) of a few actions which I feel could put the safety of our pupils (your children!) at risk. I would again ask you to take note of the following:



Some parents are **still** continuing to drive into the school grounds in order to drop off or collect pupils. If you feel this is something that you have to do (perhaps for health reasons) then I would ask that you come and speak to me and I am sure we can come to some agreement. Sadly, this is not the case with a number of people therefore I would insist that you do not drive in the school grounds as pupil's safety is our top priority!

Due to Health and Safety concerns which have been raised, when dropping off and collecting your child/children, I would ask that you walk children along the path and not over the driveway. Also when crossing the road please use the school's crossing patrol, as failure to do so can cause confusion for drivers passing by who concentrate on the designated crossing patrol outside school gates especially in the afternoons when it can be extremely busy.

I would urge you **all** to adhere to my requests as unfortunately too many accidents happen outside school gates and I am sure you would agree we do not want the gates of Bushmills Primary on the news for this reason!

# Money, Money, Money

Could I please request that when organising your child for the week ahead at school, you complete the money slips



provided and send, where possible, the exact amount required, if you are aware of the plans for the week ahead (regarding dinner money and extended school's money). Please where possible send all monies on a Monday morning.

Please be reminded that all pupils now go to the canteen at snack time in the morning and I am delighted to report that this is going well.

Please only send small amounts of money each day for your child's snack as on occasions money is being lost and is causing distress and upset to both parents and pupils.

### Water Bottles

Just a quick reminder that all pupils in Primary 2- Primary 7 should now have their own "School Water Bottles" which



have been marked clearly with their name. Rather than paying for water on a monthly basis, pupils can now bring their own personalised bottles with them to school each day.

Please note, that these bottles should be filled at home with water only, if required these can be refilled at school throughout the day. If for any reason your child requires another water bottle, these can be purchased from the school office at a cost of £2.50.

# School Bags

Please note that new school bags have been ordered with the school logos and these are now available from the school office at a cost of £4.50. Can I remind you that these are only available for pupils in Primaries I to 3.



# Breakfast Club

Breakfast Club continues on Tuesday, Wednesday and Thursday mornings from 8:20am to 8:50am at a small charge of £1.00. Pupils can choose from a selection of cereals (Cornflakes, Rice Krispies, Cheerios, Shreddies, Weetabix) as well as toast and apple juice or milk.

Once pupils have finished breakfast and if time is available there is the opportunity for them to relax and read a book! (Please note older pupils even use this opportunity to read to the younger pupils)

Please note that supervision in the playground begins each morning at 8:50am - sadly I see an increasing number of pupils (in the senior playground (P4 - P7)) arriving in school very early before supervision begins. I would love to see those arriving early coming in to Breakfast Club!



# Punctuality

Sadly, it is with a tinge of sadness that now, with only one month of school past, I have to bring up the issue of punctuality. Unfortunately, already it has been noticed that a number of our pupils are continually arriving in school late



and long after the starting time of **9:00am**. As you are aware this causes some disruption to classes as registers are completed and monies collected and sent to the office by **9:15am**. I would ask you as parents to ensure that this does not happen (I am aware that on occasions situations may arise which cannot be avoided) on a regular basis.

# Every School Day Counts

Every single day a child is absent from school equates to a day of lost learning.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	Excellent
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and I Day of Learning Missed	Unacceptable

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half of a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year - that's nearly 4 school weeks.

Give your child the best start in life - every school day counts!
